
#### KEFFER

Swedes love their denim. An explosion of labels like Cheap Monday, Acne and Dr. Denim testify. But for one Swede in particular, Maria Erixon Levin, denim is more than just a pair of trousers. From small-city Vetlanda, this mother of two began her perpetual career in denim as an illustrator, moving on to art director for JC, and then to design for in house brand, Crocker Jeans. After a managerial stint for Lee Jeans Europe (VF) Maria founded her own denim brand - Nudie Jeans - in 'bigger-city Gothenburg' back in 2001. But how to offer something different in a saturated industry? By keeping a comfortable distance from it. "It's

an anti-fashion attitude at Nudie Jeans," says Maria. "We are not nervous looking for the latest trends or market reports". Besides this, Nudie gives its jeans human qualities. "Jeans fade and bleed just like we do. they show their experience and age. We share with anyone who mourns a worn-out pair like the passing of a close friend". With such a passion for denim, it's no wonder Maria has come to realize her brand as being the largest jeans label to come out of Sweden in the last decade."We don't just offer jeans" she says, "we offer a way of thinking". And that's the naked [denim] truth.

Some days, we wouldn't meet a single person, and eventually ended up on the Lofoten Islands in Norway, in a small village called Å. Going back to Stockholm on a bus, boat and train is still stuck in my head. The sun never set, and I was awake for the whole 20-hour trip. It was a bit surreal, but really good to feel the distance we were covering, listening to Cat Power, and taking a lot of blurry photos out of the train window."

If there's one thing Katharina Poblotzki knows really well besides taking dope photos, it's how to live without money and still have fun; something she learned as a nineteen-year old Londoner. After this, the Cologne, Germany native would came back to the Rhineland, where she founded a magazine: NEUE PROBLEME (www.neue-probleme. de) She would later travel to explore the inner-

workings behind documentary film-making, in Melbourne, Copenhagen and Stockholm. Germany though, would remain her 'home'. Katharina worked as a photo and fashion editor in Köln and Berlin, the latter being her current base. Katharina studies photography at Ostkreuzschule, works as a freelance portrait and fashion photographer.

Alberta-born, Miami-raised Phillip Saunders is something of a late bloomer, his talents for skateboarding and painting not fully realized until recently. Perhaps a worried mother had stifled his exploration for a minute, but that hasn't stopped him from being so good at both. He started out at 14, drawing anime and a popular Japanese manga series written and illustrated by Akira Toriyama. "I loved Dragon Ball Z, so I started drawing the characters, and just didn't stop. After a while, I realized I was good." A year later, Saunders picked up skateboarding, despite his mothers protests. He was amazed at the neighbourhood kids sidewalk surfing. "I told my mom I wanted to skateboard and she bought me anything else with wheels; a scooter, a bike, rollerblades... Finally, my mom's friend found out what I really wanted, and she bought me a skateboard

for Christmas." With his new found freedom. Saunders was able to express himself in skating, leading him to revisit his love of visual arts. Street art was just a part of the scene, and his friends were, as he tells it, 'graffiti artists who kind of skated'. Saunders found himself picking up a can and 'just starting'. By the end of high school, he decided he wanted to learn how to paint, and has since created some pretty dope pieces, experimenting with mixed media, finding his niche in the surreal style. His sights are set on studying art in university, but Saunders will always be a skater first. In just five years, his skating abilities, and series of trick-filled YouTube videos have led him to collabo projects, including one with design brand, Yaudie. In the skate world, Saunders is as legit as they come.

One might be tempted to lump TFIB into the superficial "cool hunting" category, but founder Bobby Solomon is a little too honest, a little too sincere, for such a designation. He doesn't come prepackaged with a "formal education" or on the job experience, but what he may lack in official paperwork he makes up for

with healthy curiosity and an almost childlike wonderment of what he finds inspirational. Solomon (blogging since '07; first with Kitsune Noir -"Fox" in Japenese, "Black" in French"), uses the site as an outlet "to share [his] ideas with like-minded people." "I want people to take these ideas and these emotions and do something with them, maybe make art of their own."

Adam Turnbull packs heat. His weapon of choice? "The Wacom tablet", better known as "an artist's best friend" in many art disciplines. For the multi-talented artist, illustration, graphic arts and design challenges are met with easy precision. American writer and illustrator, Edward Gorey once said, "To take my work seriously would be the height of folly". We're pretty confident Turnbull takes his work seriously, to a point of cleverness. His art acts as a commentary, often touching on the realisms of life. Adam is quite the operative, and it shows up in his work. A mix of the seriousness the art world demands, and a care-free attitude he picked up on the shores on his native Sydney, Australia. From executing projects like that for Adidas - for which he painted 60 straight hours - to slick typography

posters telling the world that 'Everyone loves the harmonica', such variance makes for a portfolio that is a colourful sketch of many stages. Like his work, Adam too has grown in a step by step process. From designing a friend's website on a Microsoft program, with a Photoshop download on a 56k modem, to building a list of international clients, and running his own design company, Vacation Creative, Adam is fuelled by curiosity, and early on, a fear of working at a coffee shop.
